

What We Will Be Learning For The Week of Oct 18-22

Math	At the start of the week students will be learning about how pictographs can be used to display data. They will practice finding and interpreting information from different types of pictographs. Later in the week our students will learn and practice using mental addition strategies to help them find sums, and think about develop ways to think about addition.
Language	In Language lessons students will start the week listening to more of our fun-filled read aloud novel, "George's Marvellous Medicine". Later in the week they will be reading and finding information about nutrition and healthy eating habits, and continuing to build their phonetic awareness during our phonics focus series.
Unit of Inquiry	At the start of the week students will share examples from their holiday of things they did to stay happy and healthy over the break, and reflect on how their activities helped their overall well-being. Later in the week our students will learn about healthy eating, and think about the food they eat and what they can do to be healthy eaters at home.
Reading	This week students will continue to be encouraged to read non-fiction texts for their independent reading. We will continue to use the Non-Fiction Choice Board activities for students to demonstrate their learning and share the material that they choose to read.
